Thanks again to all those who became mentors/sponsors for our youth.

This fall, our new theme is "Go". We will Go and Explore who God is Calling Us 2 B. You may ask, "Where will we go?" If interested, get ready to participate and see!

As the weather cools down, we will build wider relationships and networks inside and outside of our community (intercultural experiences, First Nations community, food sharing). We are planning a dynamic programme for youth this fall, featuring more time outdoors, including:

- * Farm visiting (i.e. visiting Ploughshares Community Farm, Beausejour, Mb)
- * Exploring faith, justice, and service (both in class and on the streets – well, at least, metaphorically?)
- * Journaling with our new inventive curriculum (*Echo: the Story for Youth*) <http://wearesparkhouse.org/teens/echothestory/36/> (You can purchase a Sketch Journal from the church office for \$ 6.99)
- * Cooking workshops (our own or by attending West Broadway Community) and learning food sharing
- * Going to Youth Conference in October (recommended.)
- * Planning Mission Trips (*in our own home city*)
- * As you wished, having more Saturday Night fun (how about calling it Saturday Night Bungee?)

Let's explore who God is calling you to be! With your enthusiasm, our new year will be as eventful as the last, as we go deeper ***together*** into our journey with God.

Finance Committee Report

Following the approval of the 2015 Operating Budget at the Annual meeting held on March 8, 2015, the Finance Committee commenced a number of fundraising ideas to assist with increasing UCiM's cash flow and help reduce the potential deficit.

- 1) Launched the approved Burn the Mortgage Campaign, with the objective being repaying in full our outstanding VIM mortgage which, as at December 31, 2014 was \$76,000. We are pleased to advise that as of July 26, 2015 we have received 53 congregant donations totalling \$22,382:

23 gifts of between \$1 - \$250

7 gifts of between \$250 - \$499

15 gifts of between \$500 - \$999

8 gifts of \$1,000 or more

We are currently in the range that 53 gifts of \$1,000 will retire our mortgage in full (or 106 gifts of \$500, or 212 gifts of \$250). Every gift helps and is greatly appreciated. Thanks to everyone who has contributed.

The goal of this campaign is to pay off the mortgage early – to ensure our cash flow goes towards ministry to children, elders, and community outreach.

- 2) A series of fundraising events were held this spring resulting in net proceeds as follows:

Many thanks to everyone who helped out with these events – your efforts have been very worthwhile.

Now that we are six months into the year, where do we stand? As of June 30, 2015 we have received: General Offering - \$122,256 (short of budget by \$6,994); Fundraising (regular) - \$8,410 (exceeds budget by \$2,910); Burn the Mortgage - \$20,900 (2 year campaign goal - \$76,000.) As of June 30, 2015 we are showing a year to date operating deficit of \$4,838.

Outreach Committee Report

West Broadway Community Ministry (WBCM) Food Drive

Together with our Partners in Mission, Upstream Cluster, the Outreach Committee supports the mission of WBCM in the deliverance of their ministry in the diverse downtown area of West Broadway.

A bin is available at UCiM for emergency food collection for WBCM. The food collected is delivered to WBCM on a regular basis. The following are needed the most: *Protein foods: canned meat, fish, beans, peanut butter; Nutella; canned milk fruits and vegetables; cereal; baby food; small packages of spaghetti (1 lb.) and sauce.; meal supplements such as Boost and Ensure; juice boxes, coffee and tea, small portions of sugar and coffee whitener.*

WBCM's emergency food bank requires smaller containers as they need to be carried home. Items that do not require other ingredients and those that do not require a can opener are really appreciated. Other needs are feminine hygiene products, toothbrushes and toothpaste, soap, and shampoo, which are used to make up small shower kits.

West Broadway Community Ministry Volunteer Appreciation Dinner

The dinner was supported by Outreach and the Talking Teens group under the supervision of Erica Young and Ha Na Park.

Thank you Clare and Barb McMullen, Tannis Young, and Diane Dwarka who volunteer at WBCM. Our Men's Group and UCW also support WBCM on an ongoing basis.

Small Change Sundays

Small Change Sundays are an opportunity to put something in the offering plate when many of us use PAR. The congregation is invited to share their spare change (separate from their regular offering) as a visual demonstration of offering. The March Small Change Sunday supported Syrian refugees with \$306.28 and the May Small Change Sunday supported Rainbow Ministry with

- * **L.I.T.E.** – refers to Local Investment Toward Employment and assists inner city residents in bridging the “readiness gap” so that they are prepared to enter the workforce. Outreach has a L.I.T.E. membership and supports their work.
- * Outreach has been encouraging the support of the Syrian refugees coming to Winnipeg through **REFUGE** with the collection of household items and a concert that took place on April 19, 2015 at St. Mary’s Road United Church.
- * Provision of **grocery/gas gift cards** to members of the community is ongoing .

Memorial Fund News

BOOK of LIVES is a project of remembrance. Families who have lost a loved one may contribute one standard page (include a photograph, short genealogy and biographical summary) that will be unveiled on Unveiling Day. The Book of Lives will be kept on display in a public location in the church. This will help to continue to tell the stories of our beloved and bear witness to the faith of our people. It is the responsibility of the family to submit the information and a picture.

Submissions are due on an ongoing basis up to September 25/15.

UNVEILING DAY is based on a Maori tradition to remember a loved one, one year after their funeral/memorial service. The first UNVEILING Day will be celebrated during Sunday worship on November 1, 2015 – ALL SAINTS' DAY. For our first Unveiling Day service, submissions of all loved ones whom you wish to be remembered are welcome. To have your loved one included in the Unveiling Day service and included in the **BOOK of LIVES**, please complete a submission form and send or give it to Andrea in the church office by the **September 25, 2015 deadline.**

NOTE: After 2015, the Unveiling Day service will only include loved ones who have had funerals/memorial services at UCiM over the past two years. (e.g. 2015 & 2016). For more information contact: one of the Memorial Fund trustees or Rev. Gordon Taylor

Property Happenings

Thank you to the people who have been keeping the church landscape in such fine condition by watering and mowing - Richard Ellis, Doug Purdey, Bill Strong, Gord Stimpson, Jim Sansom, Allan Cade, Donna and Bob Bulow.

The carpeted areas in the sanctuary and MacAskill room were cleaned in July. Many people helped remove the chairs and furniture so that this task could be accomplished at minimum cost. The chairs and furniture had to be put back on Wednesday in order to have the church ready for a funeral scheduled for Thursday. Thank you to all of you that helped make this possible.

Normal maintenance has been done on the furnace fans and filters.

The cement blocks that make up the wall of the Memorial Garden have been reset thanks to the efforts of Andrea and Mike Hurst as well as Donna and Bob Bulow. Ten yards of soil will have to be purchased and spread in that area to improve the landscape between this garden and the sidewalk along Dakota Street. The soil will be purchased in August at which time help will be needed to spread it.

In order to reduce costs, janitorial service was reduced during the months of June, July, and August to one day a week from two days a week. The cost of the janitorial service has increased by eleven dollars a month due to the increase to the minimum wage.

The tiled areas of the church will have to be refinished during the month of August. It will be money well spent as this will help lengthen the life of the tiles.

The grass area that makes up most of the parking lot island and the grass area under the big tree at the church entrance are a topics of discussion for the property committee. No decision has been made about what to do. One quote was received for the installation of interlocking blocks but the cost (\$12,000) is not viable.

Please let Bob Bulow know if you can assist with painting the exterior window casings and the overhead beams in the courtyard.

Summer is coming to an end and Fall is just around the corner. It's time to start thinking about **UCiM's Annual Fall Supper.**

A Fall Supper Committee has been set up to host this year's event - they met in June to begin the planning process.

A large number of volunteers are needed to cook the food, set up for dinner, work the dinner (refilling serving dishes, keeping tea and

coffee urns filled up), clean up during and after the dinner. Approximately 280 volunteers are needed to make the Fall Supper happen. Sign up sheets will be up September 20, 2015.
